Wraparound Services
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Department Overview

CCSD Wraparound School Social Workers provide direct intervention to students and their families by supporting each student and empowering their families. School Social Workers are assigned to three schools. The Social Workers are governed by the National Association of Social Work Code of Ethics (NASW). They hold a Masters in Social Work; they either hold a Licensed Clinical Social Work (LCSW) or a Masters in Social Work (MSW), and they are also licensed by the Nevada Board of Education delivering services from kindergarten through adults.

Performance Measures

Customer Service: The Wraparound Services Department utilizes surveys to analyze customer service and plan for improvement.

Communication: The Wraparound Services Department maintains ongoing communication with school social workers, schools, parents, and community partners through monthly meetings, email messages, phone calls, and home visits with clients.

Consistency: The Wraparound Services Department demonstrates consistency by using pre-developed intake forms, parent letters, school communication, and customer service forms.

Department Services



- Evaluate student progress specific to behavioral goals set forth in students' IEPs, and monitor emotional/mental health concerns through academic progress.
- Continue the traditional school social work rubric by connecting students and families to comprehensive services within the community.
- Assist team members to understand mental health and behavioral concerns of students and advocating on behalf of the student's goals.
- Use a strengths-based and system-wide approach; focus on prevention and intervention by facilitating engagement between schools, families, and the community.
- Small group and individual/parent meetings.
- Crisis response.
- Assist with developing re-entry plans to prevent re-hospitalization.
- Attend IEP meetings upon request to assist parents with the IEP process.
- Help students develop and maintain personal, social, and academic competencies.
- Provide RTI services, link children, youth, and families to community agency resources, and align services to meet the educational needs of all students.
